

\$12,035 Awarded in 2021 to 24 women



### Build Dakota Scholarship

#### **Program Summary**

- > Started in 2015:
- T. Denny Sanford and Governor Daugaard
- ➤ 2020: T. Denny Sanford & Governor Noem reinvested in the
- Awards over 400 full-ride scholarships annually, 1/4 of those as a result of the 300+ industry partners
- Program Coordinator, Deni Amundson

#### Program Eligibility

- Attend one of four SD technical institutions
- Pursuing a degree in a high-need workforce area as determined by DOL
- Commit to work in SD for 3 years to avoid repayment

#### Program Summary


#### Announced late 2020


- > \$50 million from T. Denny Sanford
- > \$50 million from the State legislature
- > \$12.5 million from Avera Health System
- > \$12.5 million from Sanford Health System
- Program Coordinator, Elli Haerter
- First disbursements will go out for the 2022-2023 school year

#### Program Eligibility

- ➤ Have lived in SD for the last 12 months
- Pursuing a baccalaureate degree from an eligible 4-year institution
- Demonstrate financial need
- Maintain minimum GPA
- ➤ Graduate in 5 years or less
- Commit to living and working in SD for three years after graduation

### Fund Development

#### **National Giving Trends**

Individual giving records set in 2020 and remained strong in 2021.

Corporate giving decreased in 2020 and is expected to have done the same in 2021

Endowment giving is up as people contemplate legacy and lasting impact

Few gifts, larger dollar amounts

Donor-Advised Funds continue to grow in asset size

#### 2022 Outlook

Uncertainty in Washington could be a headwind to giving

Inflation likely to impact giving

Low and mid-level donors may be squeezed out nationally

Most affluent donors will likely continue to increase giving

Uncertainty around Congress' desire to put pressure on DAFs (ACE Act)
