Eligibility

Eligible Organizations

- Verified Nonprofit or Charitable Organizations
 - Tax ID# is verified nonprofit with the IRS
 - 501(c)(3) Status
- Units of government, schools & churches
- Organizations may use a Fiscal Sponsor

Not Eligible

- Private businesses
- Individuals
- Organizations <u>not</u> verified as 501(c)(3) and <u>not</u> unit of government, school or church
- Organizations on IRS Auto-Revocation List due to not filing appropriate forms
- SDCF will not consider organizations until they've received an affirmative Determination Letter from the IRS.





South Dakota Fund

- SDCF's flagship grant program
- Program and project areas supported:
 - Culture
 - Economic Development
 - Education
 - Financial Literacy
 - Health
 - Human Services





South Dakota Fund

- Grant Sizes: \$2,000 \$20,000
- Program/Project
 - Financial Literacy programs may request more
 - Match towards total project cost is required:
 - o Other grants
 - Donors
 - Fundraisers
 - o In-kind
- Rolling Grant Program
- Must take place in South Dakota



South Dakota Fund Timeline

Application Stage	Timeline/Due Date
Letter of Inquiry (LOI)	LOIs are accepted on a rolling basis.
LOI Decision: Invited or Denied	SDCF responds to LOIs within 15 working days.
Application	Applications are due 60 days after SDCF sends out an invitation to apply.
Application Decision: Awarded, Denied or Holdover	SDCF informs an applicant of their status within 90 days of the application submission date.

- Grant \$15,000
- Cultural
- Support rebuilding areas of the theater after a fire
- Fundraising and Volunteerism

- Grant \$100,000
 - \$50,000/year 2 years
- Financial Literacy
- Financial Literacy Program for South Dakota's Youth
- Volunteers & Community Support

- Grant \$20,000
- Human Services
- Support for transitional housing
- Fundraising




Nonprofit Savings Account

- Endowment building challenge grant
- Fundraising Focus
- NSA grant awards \$1 for every \$4 raised for an endowment, up to \$20,000.
- Two-year timeframe
- Outcome is an endowment fund at SDCF, with nonprofit to receive an annual distribution in perpetuity of 4.5% of the average fair market value of fund
- Funds will be designated to benefit an IRS verified nonprofit in SD
- Rolling Deadline

CSA Grant Awards in 2023

- \$1.9 million
- 570 grants to local charitable causes

Beyond Idea Grants

- Partnership with the Bush Foundation
- Community based problem-solving grants
- Grant Size: \$5,000 \$100,000/year
 - Development up to \$50,000
 - Testing/Spreading up to \$100,000
- Multi-year funding considered
- No Match Required
- Project must take place in South Dakota
- \$1.2 million will be awarded in 2024





Beyond Idea Grants

Important Considerations:

- Community-based problem solving
- To design, test and spread ideas
- To inspire, equip and connect leaders
- Planning or Implementation Grants
- Community impact potential



Beyond Idea Grants Important Criteria for BIG



- What is the community problem being addressed?
- How does the idea address the problem in an innovative and collaborative way?
- Is the idea realistic and likely to succeed?
- How are key stakeholders meaningfully involved?



BIG will not fund

- Solely general operating expenses
- General program and project costs
- Loans
- Construction





Beyond Idea Grants






Beyond Idea Grant 2024 Timeline

Bush Prize: South Dakota

in partnership with the Bush Foundation

- <u>Award</u> for organizations that have a culture of innovation and are highly valued within their communities
- Eligible organizations must have a track record of successful community problem solving, spanning at least 5 years
- Grant amounts are up to 25% of an organization's most recent fiscal year expenses, with a maximum of \$500,000
- Bush Prize grants are flexible and can be used to build up reserves
 or test that next big idea or whatever else would best
 support the organization's ongoing good work



Bush Prize: South Dakota Eligibility

- Verified Nonprofit or Charitable Organizations
 - Tax ID# is registered as nonprofit with the IRS
 - 501(c)(3) Status
 - Units of government, schools & churches
 - A verified organization may serve as a Fiscal Sponsor for other initiatives
- Must be located in South Dakota or one of the <u>9 Native nations</u> that share the same geography.
 - Community innovations highlighted must also have occurred within that geography.
- Previous Bush Prize winners are <u>not eligible</u> for 10 years
 - Organizations who have been finalists are eligible to apply again



Bush Prize: South Dakota Selection Criteria

- Does the organization have a <u>pattern of innovative solutions</u>?
- Does the organization have a <u>pattern of using inclusive</u>, <u>collaborative and resourceful processes</u>?
- Does the organizational <u>leadership foster a culture of innovation</u>?
- Is the organization stable and strong in terms of governance and finance?

Over time we seek a portfolio of winners representing the full diversity of South Dakota, and includes a variety of:

- Applicant Organization sizes
- Communities served (size and demographics)
- Types of issues addressed





Bush Prize: South Dakota 2023 Winner (\$500,000)

Black Hills Special Services Cooperative

- Provides specialized educational services and resources to cater to the unique learning needs of students and families in the Black Hills region and across the state
- BHSSC works with schools, the state, tribal councils, and families in the school communities they serve
- Long track record of educational program development, iteration and successful implementation with school partners
- Collaborative and inclusive processes, both internally and externally
- Abundance mentality when partnering with other organizations, focusing on meeting needs rather than territorial competition





Bush Prize: South Dakota 2023 Winner (\$185,000)

Lost&Found

- Advocates for mental health awareness and provides resources for individuals facing mental health challenges, reducing stigma and connecting people with vital support.
- Data-driven and collaborative work with colleges across South Dakota
- Developed and deployed a Campus Resilience Index as a planning tool, guiding a student-to-student mentorship program
- Currently developing a mobile app as a peer support tool for the digital age
- Started in the minds of high school students over 10-years ago
- Has expanded from serving a handful of universities to serving campuses across the region



Bush Prize: South Dakota 2023 Finalist (\$10,000/each)

Applications Open	April 1st
Applications Close	May 31st The application window closes at 12 p.m. Central Time/11 a.m. Mountain Time. Late applications will not be accepted.
Finalist Selection	July
Recipient Announcement	October
