
Eligibility

Eligible Organizations

- Verified Nonprofit or Charitable Organization
 - Tax ID# is verified nonprofit with the IRS
 - 501(c)(3) Status
- Units of government, schools & churches
- Organizations may use a Fiscal Sponsor
 - Provides financial management and administrative services.

Not Eligible

- Private businesses
- Individuals
- Organizations on IRS Auto-Revocation List due to not filing appropriate forms
- SDCF will not consider organizations until they've received an affirmative Determination Letter from the IRS.

South Dakota Fund

- Program/Project Expenses
- Grant Sizes: \$2,000 \$20,000
 - Multi-year funding considered
- Match required:
 - Other grants
 - Donors
 - Fundraisers
 - In-kind
- Rolling Grant Program
 - Letter of Inquiry
 - Application
- Must take place in South Dakota
- Financial Literacy programs may request more



South Dakota Fund Timeline

Application Stage	Timeline/Due Date
Letter of Inquiry (LOI)	LOIs are accepted on a rolling basis.
LOI Decision: Invited or Denied	SDCF responds to LOIs within 15 working days.
Application	Applications are due 60 days after SDCF sends out an invitation to apply.
Application Decision: Awarded, Denied or Holdover	SDCF informs an applicant of their status approximately 90 days of the application submission date.


Nonprofit Savings Account

- Endowment building challenge grant
- Fundraising Focus
- NSA grant awards \$1 for every \$4 raised for an endowment, up to \$20,000
- Two-year timeframe to raise \$80,000
- Outcome is an endowment fund at SDCF, with nonprofit to receive an annual distribution in perpetuity of 4.5% of the average fair market value of fund
- Funds will be designated to benefit an IRS verified nonprofit in SD
- Rolling Deadline

CSA Grant Awards in 2024

- 656 grants to local charitable causes

in partnership with the Bush Foundation

- Community based problem-solving grants
- Grant Size: \$5,000 \$100,000/year
 - Development up to \$50,000
 - Testing/Spreading up to \$100,000
- Multi-year funding considered
- No Match Required
- Project must take place in South Dakota
- \$1.2 million will be awarded in 2025





Important Considerations:

- To develop, test and spread ideas
- To inspire, equip and connect leaders
- Planning or Implementation Grants
- Community impact potential



Important Criteria for BIG



- What is the community problem being addressed?
- How does the idea address the problem in an innovative and collaborative way?
- Is the idea realistic and likely to succeed?
- How are key stakeholders meaningfully involved?

BIG will not fund



- Solely general operating expenses
- General program and project costs
- Loans
- Construction

Family Connections Center

\$100,000

Safe Place Youth Emergency Shelter provides overnight housing from 11 pm to 8 am, offering a safe alternative designed specifically for youth. It aims to reduce exposure to additional risk factors.



South Dakota Native Homeownership Coalition \$73,000

Expanding a Construction Internship Program designed to provide practical training and address the workforce gap in residential construction.



Midwest Street Medicine

\$90,000

Provide direct healthcare services to the unhoused to manage communicable diseases, prevent outbreaks, and ensure better health outcomes for this vulnerable group.



Helpline Center


\$95,000

Implement the Transition to SuccessTM collective impact model, an evidence-based system that coordinates care across social determinants of health to treat poverty, aiming to help families move out of poverty and promote health equity.

Bush Prize: South Dakota

in partnership with the Bush Foundation

- <u>Award</u> to celebrate organizations that are highly valued within their communities and have a track record of transformational impact through creative solutions.
- Eligible organizations must have a track record of successful community problem solving, spanning at least 3-5 years.
- Two organizations a year will be selected as Bush Prize: South Dakota honorees receiving \$250,000 each.
- Bush Prize: South Dakota grants are flexible and can be used to build up reserves or test that next big idea or whatever else would best support the organization's ongoing good work.

Bush Prize: South Dakota Eligibility

- Verified Nonprofit or Charitable Organization
 - Tax ID# is a verified nonprofit with the IRS
 - 501(c)(3) Status
 - Units of government, schools & churches
 - A verified organization may serve as a Fiscal Sponsor for other initiatives
- Must be located in South Dakota or one of the <u>9 Native nations</u> that share the same geography.
 - Community innovations highlighted must also have occurred within that geography.
- Previous Bush Prize winners are <u>not eligible</u> for 10 years
 - Organizations who have been finalists are eligible to apply again



Bush Prize: South Dakota Selection Criteria

- Does the organization have a pattern of <u>transformational impact</u>?
- Does the organization have a <u>history of creative solutions</u>?
- Is the organization creative in <u>community problem solving with strong leadership</u> <u>and a culture of innovation</u>?
- Is the organization stable and strong in terms of governance and finance?

Over time we seek a portfolio of honorees representing the full diversity of South Dakota, and includes a variety of:

- Organization sizes
- Communities served (size and demographics)
- Types of ideas identified



Bush Prize: South Dakota 2024 Winner (\$500,000)

Call to Freedom

- Dedicated to bringing healing to individuals impacted by sex and labor trafficking and commercial sex exploitation by navigating a healing path through their continuum of care model.
- Collaborate with other like-minded organizations and developed a replicable model of care that can be adapted by other communities.
- A cornerstone of CTF's efforts is Marissa's House, a 12-unit apartment complex designed to support the recovery of human trafficking survivors while keeping their families together. It provides a safe environment for individuals as they work toward rebuilding their lives and transitioning out of trafficking situations.

Applications Open	April 1st
Applications Close	April 30th The application window closes at 12 p.m. Central Time/11 a.m. Mountain Time. Late applications will not be accepted.
Finalist Selection	August
Recipient Announcement	October
