Private Foundation


- Single primary source of revenue
- Chief activity is grant making to other organizations









Public Charity Density of South Dakota, with Comparable States



Number of South Dakota Private Foundations, with Comparable States




Percentage of South Dakota Public Charities by Annual Revenue








Percentage of Revenue Source for South Dakota Public Charities







Concentration of Resources Among South Dakota Public Charities by Field Type





South Dakota Public Charities Expenditures



Flow of Grant Dollars Into South Dakota between 2010-2015




